





WHAT are Board Authority Authorized (BAA) courses, and WHY are they needed?



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Guiding Principles

- Courses **must be** aligned with the Ministry of Education's "Know-Do-Understand" curriculum design
- Courses **may not** overlap with current course content in a significant way, or be remedial or modified versions
- Courses **can** count towards elective credits (Grades 10-12) in the Graduation Program, but **NOT** as targeted credit (e.g.: Social Studies 11/12 credit)
- Courses **may not** be used toward the Adult Graduation Program

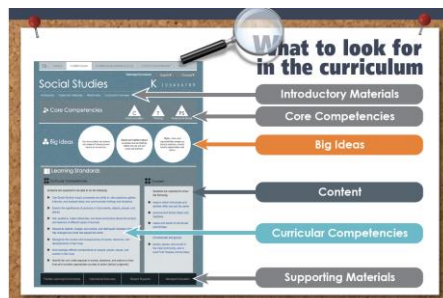


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What is the process for BAA Courses?



1. **New**
2. **Revised**
3. **Retired**



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History

2018 BC'S New Curriculum – all BAA Courses reviewed

2020 Disruption

2024 February – Audit – School level BAA

April/May – Comprehensive Review (retire, revise, no action)

July-October – Summer/Fall writes of draft Frameworks.

October-December– Joint Committee Process and Revisions

November – Board Meeting, information and feedback

December – Board Meeting, 9 courses for approval

2025 January – Board Presentation 4 courses for approval

February – Joint Committee to create annual review cycle
