#### **DMA Mandarin Film Night**

#### **Warton Global High School Competition**

The Wharton Global High School Investment Competition is a free, experiential investment challenge for high school students grades 9-12. Students work in teams of four to seven and have access to an online stock market simulator. Together, they learn about strategy-building, teamwork, communication, risk, diversification, company and industry analysis, and many other aspects of investing.



Under the guidance of Ms. Skelley, four grade 9 students participated in the program, which involved managing a portfolio, preparing a report, etc. The students gained insights into strategizing, understanding investment goals, global investing and more.

## **Model UN Competition**

January 31<sup>st</sup>- February 2<sup>nd</sup>, 13 Argyle students in the debate club participated in the Vancouver Model UN Conference. This is the largest student-led conference in North America. Students joined 1600 delegates from all around BC, Washington, Oregon and Alberta and were immersed in a thriving fast-paced environment, working together to create practical and dynamic solutions to the world's most pressing problems.

## **Argyle Library Weaving Project**



For the past two years Argyle students and staff have been working on a school-wide Coast Salish weaving project. Students from across the school came to the Library to learn teachings from Skwxwú7mesh Nation member Courtney Kessel, Indigenous Support Worker, and Laura Ellwood, Indigenous Support Teachers about Indigenous Weaving and created Quarter bags.

Students also participated in the school-wide project creating two wall hangings that are now displayed in the library. The colours chosen for the project were traditional Indigenous colours and Argyle's school colours of Green and Gold.

Once the panels were created Argyle Indigenous students learned about the importance of smudging with Courtney Kessel. The wall hangings were installed in the library after being smudged. Thank you to Courtney and Laura for sharing with our students and for our administration team in supporting us in this project!
