Graduation Assessments

Students graduating in British Columbia need to complete three <u>provincially mandated</u> <u>assessments</u>: Literacy 10, Numeracy 10, and Literacy 12. Students in the French Immersion Program also need to complete French Literacy 12. Assessments can only be offered by schools four times per year.

This year, students in Grade 12 wrote Literacy 12 in October; students in Grade 10 write Literacy 10 and Numeracy 10 in January. French Literacy 12 is scheduled for June, 2025.

We will be offering make up assessments in April and June 2025. If your student is missing an assessment, they need to reach out to Vice Principal Ms. Motaghedi smotaghedi@sd44.ca to ensure they are scheduled to write in April.

Online Course Selection Only

This year, we are doing away with paper forms. Students will need to select their courses for 2025-26 online in MyEducation BC: they will have the chance to list required courses, electives, and alternate choices. In April, we will be sending home course verification reports requiring parent/ guardian signature to confirm students' course choices for 2025-2026. Please contact the Argyle office if your student does not have access to MyEducation BC.

Graduation Status Update

Graduation status update reports will be published to MyEducation BC student and parent accounts of current grade 10, 11, and 12 students the week of February 10th. This report shows the graduation requirements students have completed or that are in progress, as well as which requirements are outstanding. Please consult this report to assist in course selection for 2025-26.


Spring Athletics - Coaches needed!

School-wide survey


