## **School Startup Forms**



## **Personal Digital Devices**

In line with BC Ministry of Education's 2024 policy, use of personal digital devices is restricted at school this year. We are enforcing a three step policy across the school and are engaging in important conversations with students about phone use, focus, and mental health.

## Green Thumb Theatre - Shape of a Girl

On Wednesday, November 13<sup>th</sup> we will be welcoming back <u>Green Thumb Theatre</u> to perform Shape of a Girl. Green Thumb Theatre uses live performances to address complex issues in youth-appropriate terms in schools across Canada: their goal is "to "[provide] a way for young people to reflect on the kinds of issues that they may be curious about or grappling with themselves, but don't feel comfortable broaching in a traditional classroom setting."

Written by Joan MacLeod and based on real events in BC, Canada, this production is designed to help students gain a deeper understanding of the various forms bullying can take, how one might be complicit and especially how it can affect themselves and their peers. With the aim of ensuring a safe and supportive environment for all viewers, student audience are advised this production contains themes and scenes that may be sensitive for some viewers. The play addresses issues including **bullying**, **peer pressure**, **mental health struggles**, **and references to violence and abuse**.

While these topics are explored thoughtfully and realistically, they may be distressing for some audience members. We encourage students to take care of their emotional well-being, and if you feel the need to step out or seek support, please do not hesitate to reach out to a teacher or counselor present during the performance.

There will be a question and answer period following each performance, where students can connect with cast and crew to follow up on thoughts and feeling inspired by the show.
