

#### **School Fees & Startup Forms**

A reminder that all families received an email from the NVSD in early September with instructions on completing the 3 online forms through School Cash Online. If you have not yet done so, please fill these out as soon as possible. If you have any questions about these forms, please call our office at 604-903-3300. These forms do not require any payment. School Cash Online is simply the platform the school district uses to collect this information. See these instructions on how to create a School Cash Online account.

School and course fees will be added to School Cash Online accounts in early October.

#### **Student Attendance**

To report an absence please email <a href="mailto:argyle\_attendance@sd44.ca">argyle\_attendance@sd44.ca</a> and include the following information in the BODY of the email: Full name of student, Date of Absence, Times of absence.

If a student is marked absent by a teacher you will receive a phone call and an email notifying you of this absence. If you would like to excuse the absence please reply to the email notification and we can make that change. If the student feels they have been marked absent incorrectly the student needs to speak directly to their teacher.

For planned absences in excess of 5 days please have your student drop by the office for an "extended absence" form that needs to be filled out the week before the absence.

#### **Personal Digital Devices**

In keeping with the Ministry of Education's new policy, Argyle has moved forward with restricted cell phone use for all students. We are thrilled with the commitment our community has made to this new policy as we limit cell phone use in school.

The North Vancouver School District (NVSD) is focused on "devices off, learning on." The following guidelines are in place and part of Argyle's Code of Conduct:

All students in the school community are expected to leave personal digital devices at home, in their bag/backpack, and/or in their locker during instructional time. Allowances may be made by the staff for instructional purposes, digital literacy, appropriate use based on age and developmental stage, accommodations within a student's Individualized Education Plan, accessibility, medical and health needs, and/or equitable support for learning outcomes.

Across all NVSD secondary schools, access to and use of personal digital devices is not permitted during instructional time. At the teacher's discretion, an exemption may be made when the use of such devices supports a specific curricular objective and is part of instructional planning. If you have any questions, please contact your child's case manager.

If you need to contact your child during the day, please call (604) 903-3300 and a school staff member will deliver a message to them.



## **School Updates & Upcoming Events**

#### **Hope U Anti-Racism Workshops**

At Argyle, we are committed to creating a learning environment that values diversity, equity and inclusion. In support of this <u>school goal</u>, this fall we are happy to partner with North shore-based <u>Hope U</u> to deliver school-wide assemblies and workshops focused on anti-racism and equity.

All students will participate in grade-wide assemblies on Monday, October 7<sup>th</sup> and follow-up workshops will be taking place in English classes throughout October and November. The purpose of these workshops is to create a safe space for students to learn and talk about: racism, bias, privilege, cultural appropriation, and microaggressions and our collective role in creating change through unity.

We are excited to bring this important work to Argyle and continue this learning in classes throughout the year. We thank the Argyle PAC for partnering with us financially to make these learning opportunities possible for all students. You can learn more about Hope U through this video.

#### **Learning Conferences**

Argyle's Learning conferences (parent teacher interviews) are fast approaching on Thursday, October 17<sup>th</sup>. Parents/ guardians will receive an email next week with instructions on how to set up an account to book appointments between 2:30-4:30pm and 6:00-8:00pm. Teachers will be available for five minute interview times per student.

#### **Goal Setting**

This year, we are continuing our school-wide goal setting workshops throughout the year. The first workshop will take place on **Friday, October 4**th. Goal setting is a new requirement for all students in the BC 2023 Reporting Order. At Argyle, we coach students throughout the year to set goals, monitor their progress, re-assess their goals and hopefully see tangible results. To support this, we will have an alternate bell schedule on Friday, October 4th which involves shortening flex time:

8:30am – Flex Time 8:45am – Period 3 starts 9:55am – Period 3 ends – goal-setting workshop 10:20am – Break & regular daily schedule resumes

The next goal-setting sessions will take place on: January 24<sup>th</sup> and April 4<sup>th</sup> with the same bell schedule.



#### **Breakfast Program**

We are now offering a breakfast program for students during flex time 8:30-9:00am. Students can access bagels and fresh fruit daily in the Choices room 183. If your family needs more support for groceries at home, please contact your child's grade administrator.
