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

2. Final Goal Setting Session

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3. Year End Information

This week grade 8 French Immersion students from Argyle, Handsworth and Windsor are on a fieldtrip to Quebec. Students visited the Longhouse at Wendake Village – Nation Huronne, Cabane a Sucre, tried École de Cirque (circus school), ate traditional French foods such as poutine, and hiked to local waterfalls among other things.



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




Argyle's new aquaponics system in Mr. Bentley's classroom produced its 1st crop of lettuce! Aquaponics is a food production system that combines aquaculture (the cultivation of fish) with hydroponics (the growing of plants) where nutrient-rich aquaculture water is fed to hydroponically grown plants. This is a prototype for a much larger version to be built on the roof-top deck. This project has many curricular ties to science and foods that will be explored in the coming year.

In athletics, many teams are competing at the Spring Provincial Championships. Argyle's tennis team finished 5th in B.C while Argyle's senior girls' and boys' rugby teams and the senior girls' soccer team are all competing in Provincials that wrap up today or tomorrow. Argyle's co-ed ice hockey team finished their season yesterday by winning the North Shore High School Hockey League. Several track and field athletes have qualified for Provincials taking place in Nanaimo, and several mountain bikers just returned from Provincials in Squamish.

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
