

Graduation Requirements

- Minimum 80 credits
- Minimum 4 Grade 12 level courses including English 12
- At least 28 credits must be elective course credits (gr 10-12)
- Career-Life Education 10 (4 credits)
- Career-Life Connections 12 (4 credits)
- Physical and Health Education 10 (4 credits)
- Science 10 (4 credits), and a Science 11 or 12 (4 credits)
- Social Studies 10 (4 credits), and a Social Studies 11 or 12 (4 credits)
- A Math 10 (4 credits), and a Math 11 or 12 (4 credits)
- A Language Arts 10 (two 2-credit courses), 11 and 12
- One Arts Education or Applied Design, Skills, Technologies 10-12
- One Indigenous-focused course 11-12 (4 credits)



Advanced Placement (AP)

AP gives students the chance to tackle university-level work while still in high school and they may earn university credit and advanced placement (eg: take 2nd year course instead of 1st year course)

AP exams are in May and scheduled by the AP College Board.



Ministry of Education & Childcare Transcripts

- Record of successfully <u>completed</u> Gr. 10, 11 & 12 courses and the Graduation Assessment results
- Unofficial transcripts are on Student Transcript Services Website (BCeID account required)
- Only the Ministry can issue an Official Transcript
- If a certified hardcopy is required see counsellor
- Students can order an official copy of their final transcript through the STS in July 2025.

Transcripts (vs Diploma Verification)

Students are responsible for checking the accuracy of the information on their Transcript.

Please check:

- Student's name is spelled correctly, birth date is correct
- Student has enough credits for graduation
- Student has met all graduation requirements
- Student has credits for all courses completed and any mark changes are reflected

Applying to Post Secondary

If students apply early, universities base early acceptance on grade 11 marks and interim semester 1 marks

In CLC12, students select Post-Secondary Institutions (PSI) to whom they will grant e-access to transcript information from the Ministry of Education. This is done through Student Transcript Service.

Applying to Post Secondary Institutions

- CHECK THE WEBSITE OF THE PROGRAM YOU ARE APPLYING TO!
- Many Applications for BC are completed online at www.educationplannerbc.ca
- Early admission vs Standard admission
- Decision of acceptance usually occurs in March-June (unless early acceptance offered)
- September 2025 PSI course registration occurs in June to August
- Final Transcript sent to PSIs student has selected in July.

EducationPlannerBC

- Application online: https://www.educationplannerbc.ca/
- Information needed includes...
 - Top 3 choices for post-secondary institutions in BC
 - Personal Education Number (PEN)
 - 9 digits on the top of report card
 - Programs and/or Faculty (1st, 2nd choice)
- Application Fee ranges from \$50 to \$150 per institution
- After applying, students can check status of application through student account created for each PSI

What About My Grades?

Admission Averages

 based on *specific* Grade 11 and 12 courses – it varies from institution to institution (depends on the specific program requirements of each institution, check websites)

Self-reporting grades

self-reporting is on the honour system

Electronic transmission of grades to the Ministry of Education

- PSI ~ Post Secondary Institutes Choices Form (on Student Transcript Service website)
- Ministry of Ed. automatically forwards transcript data to the BC and Canadian Institutes of the student's choice only.

What About My Grades?

- Final Transcripts
 - date TBD by Ministry; typically late July
- Registration for classes at PSI once accepted
 - may be based on marks generally first choice goes to students with the highest marks

It's not all about marks...

For many institutions and programs, grades are only part of the picture. Some are taking a "holistic" assessment of the applicant which may include:

Conditional Acceptance

Application, courses and grades meet criteria for early acceptance

Students must keep achievement consistent as acceptance is based on Final marks

What may vary is when you hear of acceptance

If *Percent Average* is really high, a scholarship may be offered by the PSI

- American Universities determine the eligibility of applicants by their Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) or ACT results combined with their High School marks (gr. 9-12).
- You may have to write the SAT exam if you are planning to attend a U.S. university.
- If NCAA is a consideration please see Ms. Dash

Scholarships

Common criteria:

- Academic achievement
- Leadership
- Community involvement/volunteer work
- Extracurricular activities

**Al generated paragraphs or essays will disqualify applicants immediately.

Provincial Government Scholarships and Awards

- ** Must meet graduation requirements and be a Canadian citizen
- BC Excellence Scholarships (55 awards of \$5000)
 - 1 student nominated per school
 - Winners demonstrate community service and aptitude/commitment to chosen career path.
- BC Achievement Scholarships
 - BC Achievement Scholarships recognize the top 8000 graduates in the province.
 \$1250
 - The Ministry of Education will determine recipients based on achievement in Grades 10, 11, and 12 courses that satisfy <u>2018 Graduation Program</u> requirements, including elective courses.
- Path to Teacher Education Scholarship
 - 20 scholarships for \$5000 for students who have shown aptitude/commitment for a career path in teaching. Students apply through Ministry of Education website.

Provincial Government Scholarships and Awards (cont.)

** Must meet graduation requirements and be a Canadian citizen

District/Authority Scholarships

- excellence in non-academic subject areas (\$1250)
 - rewards graduating students for superior achievement in their chosen non-academic
 - students must excel in a non-academic area in one of the following areas:
 - Fine Arts
 - International Languages
 - Applied Skills
 - Community Service
 - Physical Activity
 - Technical and Trades Training
 - Aboriginal Language and Culture
 - Argyle is normally allotted around 24-28 of these awards.
 - Teachers nominate their top students, winners chosen by Argyle's scholarship committee

Post Secondary Entrance Scholarships

- Post-Secondary Institutes offer a variety of awards to students entering their 1st year.
- Application form and marks in the 85% + range along with community involvement are usually required.
- Some major entrance awards require community service and nomination from Argyle
- Some are renewable based on marks
- Deadlines: Vary by institution varies check websites!

Local Scholarships

- There is a pool of scholarships and bursaries decided at the school level by Argyle's Scholarship Committee (\$200 - \$2000)
- Students must follow all instructions and apply online through the link on the Argyle website or the Scholarship Team
- Application open from Dec. 1 Jan. 31
- General criteria includes:
 - Good to excellent academic standing, citizenship, attendance
 - Volunteer service within the school and/or community
 - Extracurricular involvement within the school and/or community
 - Leadership experiences within the school and/or community
- Refer to <u>Argyle Scholarship and Bursary Information Booklet</u> on the Argyle website

Argyle Awards – Eligibility

To be eligible for Argyle Awards applicants must:

- Be enrolled in a minimum of 7 courses (includes CLC) *for OL must be NVOL, or completed OL by mid-April.
- Have good character and citizenship
- Be enrolled in Grade 12 for the first time
- Be eligible to graduate
- Be a Canadian citizen or landed immigrant
- Preference is given to students who have been at Argyle for the past two years
- Peak Performance students are eligible

Completing the Argyle Application

- Go to the MS Scholarship Team Channel > Argyle scholarships
- Complete Online Application (open from Dec. 1 Jan. 31)
- NO EDITS CAN BE MADE to this application once you have submitted it
- Submit:
 - Part 1 Online application
 - Part 2 Hard Copy of Letter of Application (refer to guidelines) & passport size photo on the letter
- All applications must be submitted to Ms. Malone no later than 9am January
 31st.
- Late or incomplete applications will not be considered!

Argyle Awards – Selection Process

Largest awards will go to the worthiest applicants

- Usually one award per student
- Selections made based on specific criteria outlined for each award
- Some are non-academic awards
- Argyle Music Awards Application is separate from this selection
- Must prove registration in a post-secondary institution by fall 2025 to claim award
