Fresh Air Fridays

Dear Parents and Guardians,

Spring is here and you and your children are invited to join us for **Fresh Air Fridays!**

The intention of **Fresh Air Fridays** is to encourage active travel – walking, biking, or rolling – to and from school and to reduce traffic and parking congestion on the streets surrounding the school.

The project will run between **Friday, April 19 and Friday, June 7**, with the goal of getting at least 60% of the student population of Capilano Elementary walking, biking, or rolling to school. There will be prizes and raffles for students who choose active travel to get to school, and there will be plenty of celebrating and fun activities along the way! Every Friday that a student walks, bikes, rolls, or drives to 5 will be a chance to win!

Families, we need your help to understand how people in our community are getting to and from school, and how we can make improvements to increase active travel! Please take 5 minutes to complete the Family Travel Habit Survey: https://forms.office.com/r/pKzmcmzbji

Why participate:

- 1. Students who engage in physical activity before school arrive ready to learn.
- 2. Get to know your neighbours and your neighbourhood.
- 3. Walking, biking, and rolling independently builds self-confidence and lifelong habits.
- 4. Fewer cars in school zones increases safety, improves air quality, and reduces carbon emissions.
- 5. It's fun!

How to participate:

- 1. Please take the time to complete the Family Travel Habit Survey.
- 2. Walk, bike, or roll to school! If you don't already walk, bike, or roll to school consider trying it out on Fridays. Leave a bit earlier, plan your route ahead of time, or join a friend and walk, bike, or roll together.
- 3. If you have to drive, consider driving only part way. "Drive to 5" by picking a location with lots of parking about a 5-minute walk from the school. In our neighbourhood, anywhere along Keith Road between Pemberton Ave and Bridgman Ave is a great place to park and walk.
- 4. If you can't drive part way, support the students and families walking, biking, and rolling by taking extra care on the streets surrounding the school. Obey all traffic signs and expect to see more people on foot, bikes, and scooters.

Learning Environments 2024-2025

In May and June of each year, we begin the planning process of developing class organization for the upcoming school year. During this time, we begin placing students into possible class groupings. However, as enrolment can change over the coming months, student placements are not finalized until September of the new school year.

Our class placement process ensures that thoughtful consideration of each child's social, emotional and academic needs align with the need to create a balanced and effective learning environment. Students are assigned to classes by a team made up of the School Based Resource Team, the child's current teacher(s), non-enrolling teacher(s), support staff and school administrators. This professional team considers each placement very carefully as they create classes that include a wide range of students who learn in a variety of ways. We strive to build classes to best support all students' learning in an inclusive educational environment. In addition to individual circumstances, criteria considered in the placement process include:

- 1. Workable instructional groups considering:
 - a. The child's academic challenges, strengths, work habits and independence
 - b. Teaching and learning styles
- 2. Positive social groups considering:
 - a. Placements where a child can work positively and productively with other children in the class
 - b. Known peer support or peer conflicts
 - c. Establishing the presence of positive peer leaders in each class
- 3. Balanced classes considering:
 - a. Students with diverse needs
 - b. Students who are English Language Learners
 - c. Academic, social and emotional needs and abilities
 - d. Leadership abilities

If there is information that the current classroom teacher and/or the principal **does not have** and should be aware of when placing your child in classes for next year, please fill in the accompanying Capilano Parent Input Form for consideration and email the form to Ms. Kammi Clark, Principal (kclark@sd44.ca) by May 31, 2024. Please note that an accompanying letter, or naming a specific teacher, is not part of the criteria and **will not be accepted**. Further, forms received after this date **will not be** considered.
