Personal Digital Devices

We want to express our appreciation for your support and cooperation with the new personal digital device (PDD) guidelines that were introduced at the start of this school year. As we move forward with these changes, it's clear that the success of this initiative relies heavily on the collaboration between families, students, and staff, and we are incredibly grateful for your efforts.

As you are aware, across all NVSD secondary schools, access to and use of personal digital devices will not be permitted during instructional time. At the teacher's discretion, an exemption may be made when the use of such devices supports a specific curricular objective and is part of instructional planning.

We want to acknowledge how well students have adapted and how staff has been instrumental in ensuring a smooth transition. Their dedication to creating a focused, engaged, and distraction-free learning environment is making a positive difference in the Carson Graham community. If you message your child(ren) during the day, please be aware that they likely will not respond until the next class break.





If there is an urgent need to reach your child that cannot wait until the next class break, please contact the Carson Graham office.

The slogan we've been using, "Devices off, learning on", captures the essence of what we are all working toward: a space where students can focus on their education without unnecessary distractions. Your role in reinforcing this message at home is invaluable, and we are grateful for your partnership in helping your child(ren) understand the importance of these guidelines. As you work with your child(ren) to foster healthy digital habits, you may find the following resources helpful to support these conversations:

If students are using a PDD without permission:

First time – staff will talk with student and ask them to put the PDD away.

Second time – staff will talk with student, staff will contact home, and student will be asked to bring the PDD to the office to hand in for the day.

Third time – student will be referred to the office with PDD. Administrator will contact home. Student may be required to check device in at the office at the start and end of the day.

By working together—families, students, and staff—we can create an environment where all students can thrive, both academically and personally.
