We are proud to offer the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (DP). The DP is an internationally recognized, **university preparatory program** that is widely acknowledged as the most prestigious high school diploma available to students.

Guiding both teaching and learning in the program are the IBO Mission Statement and Learner Profile.

The DP curriculum is rigorous. It is a two-year program in grades 11 and 12.
