## S2 Final Learning Updates (Report Cards) to be Published on June 26th

Semester 2 Final Learning Updates (Report Cards) will be published to the MyEd Parent Portal on June 26, 2024 by end of day.

Parents/Guardians are encouraged to <u>log in and update their account now</u> so you can access them on the 26th. Help with your parent/guardian portal account can be found below as well as on the <u>Handsworth website</u> and the <u>District website</u>.



#### To Access the MyEducation BC System:

1. Visit <u>https://www.myeducation.gov.bc.ca/aspen/logon.do</u>. We recommend that you bookmark this page and that you **use a desktop computer or laptop** instead of a mobile device.

2. Make sure popups are enabled for your browser.

3. <u>Your Login ID is the email address that you have given to the school</u>. Both usernames and passwords are case sensitive. Five unsuccessful log in attempts will disable your account. Passwords are good for 90 days.

4. If it is your first time signing in or it has been more than 90 days since your last password change, you will be prompted to change your password immediately. You will also need to enter security information so that in the future you can click "I forgot my password" to receive a new password. MyEd BC Parent Portal - how to reset password.pdf

5. Once inside the MyEducation BC system, you can navigate around to view information for your student(s). When reports are published to the Portal, they are accessible in the Published Reports area and will appear as PDF documents.

**\*PLEASE NOTE:** Students that are cross-enrolled in courses outside of Handsworth Secondary, may have more than one report.

**Parents New to Handsworth:** Please check your email inbox and junk mail for an email from accounts such as sysop@myeducation.gov.bc.ca or admin@myeducation.gov.bc.ca which will include your User ID, temporary password and instructions.

**Questions/Concerns?** Should you have any questions or concerns about Parent Portal access, please do not hesitate to contact us at **handsworth@sd44.ca**. Please include your name as well as your Handsworth student's first and last name and the issue you are having. We will respond to your inquiry as soon as possible. We receive a high volume of inquiries in the week leading up to and immediately after Report Cards being posted so we recommend ensuring that you are able to successfully log in before the report card publication date.

#### **Reminder:**

Please **save/print all 2023-24 Report Cards prior to the end of July** as all published reports are <u>wiped</u> from the MyEducation BC portal on July 31st of every year.

When you login in September, you will <u>not</u> see Report Cards from previous years.

## Handsworth Senior Ultimate Team Provincial AAA Champions!



The Senior Ultimate Team wrapped up their incredible season in May at the BC 3A Provincial Tournament. The Royals entered Provincials with a 25-4 record and finished first at North Shore Playoffs and the Vancouver Sea to Sky Tournaments. The team was ranked second going into Provincials and went undefeated (3-0) in pool play, outscoring opponents 39-6. After defeating Steveston-London and Burnaby South in the quarterfinals and semifinals, the Royals went up against host team, and number 1 ranked, South Kamloops in the finals. The Royals held an 8-5 lead going into half, but South Kamloops battled hard in the second to tie the game at 10-10. In the end, Handsworth leaned on an efficient offense and a tenacious defensive effort to win the game 15-11! **Michael Caddick** led all players with seven goals, **Nate Bernardi** had 34 completions, **Zach Bernardi** finished with 9 assists, and **Claire McJannet** had 5 passes defended to help seal the win!

This is the first time Handsworth has won the 3A Senior Ultimate Provincial Tournament and is a tremendous achievement for the players! Shout outs to team captains **Max Kapuscinski, Daniel** "**Meow Meow**" **Mao, Paige Chapman,** and **Claire McJannet** for their steady leadership throughout the season. I hope the entire team takes some time to rest and relax in the offseason and can't wait to see what next year brings!



## Handsworth Hosts First North Shore Queer Prom

On May 23rd, Handsworth Pride Club hosted the North Shore's first Queer Prom! This event was a long time coming; students first applied for a grant from the "It Gets Better Foundation" in February 2023. The goal was to foster belonging and community amongst Queer youth who might sometimes feel isolated. To everyone's surprise, the Handsworth team was generously awarded 10,000 USD. From there, a student team lead by Maya Mount, Atlas Chow, and Ms. Brodie partnered with a variety of local organizations including North Shore Restorative Justice and LETS.

On May 23rd, they hosted a spectacular celebration at the Pipe Shop at Lonsdale Quay. The event sold out! Over 300 youth aged 12-20 from 21 high schools and 6 different school districts across the lower mainland attended. Students made new friends, connected with various organizations, enjoyed live performances from the band Queer as Funk and Drag Performances from Genesis and Bongganisa, and danced the night away!

Big thanks to all the staff and students volunteers that made this night possible, and of course "It Gets Better!" Students are now exploring ways to make this an annual event without the grant.
