Orange Shirt Day Assembly

Today at school was Orange Shirt Day to show our collective support of Indigenous peoples in advance of National Day for Truth and Reconciliation. At our assembly this morning, it was evident that your children have taken to heart what they have learned about the marginalization of Indigenous peoples through residential schooling. They were quietly respectful and reflective throughout the assembly. What made the assembly special was the students who volunteered to share words with our school community.



Students whose first language is not English courageously shared with the audience words in their home languages about why September 30th is now recognized as National Day for Truth and Reconciliation. After they spoke, in keeping with Indigenous oral tradition, some student leaders chose to speak from the heart to share their perspectives on past wrongs and how apologies without actions are empty and not enough. Another student shared his grandparents' story of attending residential school. Finally, and importantly, two students then shared a message in Skwxwú7mesh sníchim to wish everyone a peaceful Orange Shirt Day, which shows that language and cultural revitalization for Indigenous peoples is not only a goal, but it is *happening*. All of these student speakers should be very proud of themselves as their voices had a powerful impact on our school community. Our goal for all students is to provide them meaningful teachings and encourage them to use their voices and ideas to take action for reconciliation. Today provided clear evidence of exactly that. Huy chexw men men.
