




Advanced Placement (AP) Psychology

- AP courses are first year university-level courses for high school students
- helps prepare students for university level courses while still in high school
- can take the AP exam in May to potentially score 4 or 5 to receive first year course credit for university (consult with instituion of choice)
- nearly all Canadian & U.S. universities accept AP courses as do many international schools for entrance
- AP courses on transcripts can help a student stand out





- Programming "Open House" when teachers open Tutorial Time to talk about course offerings, descriptions, pathways, learning styles etc.






