- The Graduation Program begins in Grade 10
- Students require a minimum of **80 credits** in grades 10, 11, and 12 to graduate
- 30 hours of volunteer or work experience between grades 10-12
- **52 required credits**

- A minimum of **16 credits** (4 courses) must be at the Grade 12 level
- **4 credits** must be an Indigenous-focused course

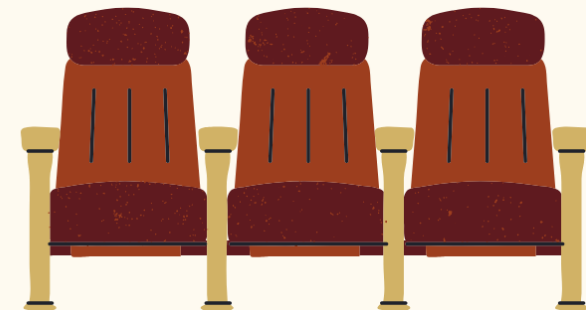




NEW COURSE OFFERING for 2025-2026

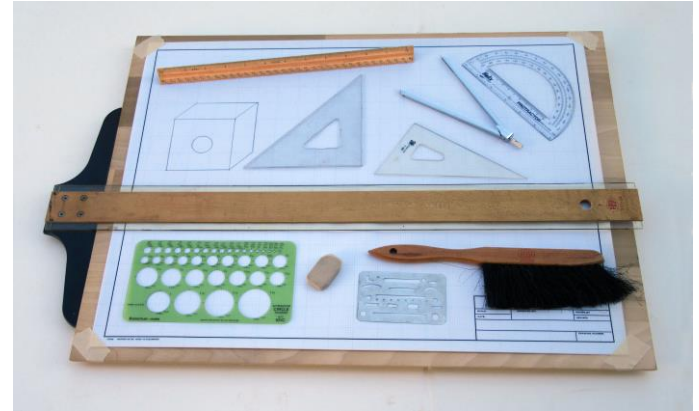

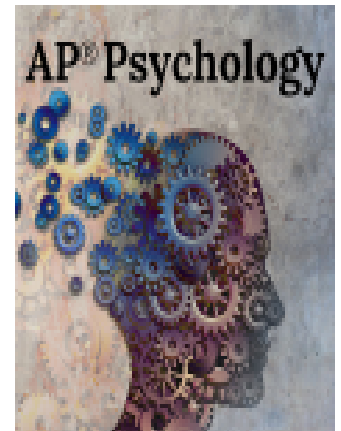

English 12 First Peoples



This course explores the diverse experiences, values, beliefs, and perspectives of First Peoples through a variety of texts. Students engage with different forms of expression, including oral storytelling, speech, poetry, drama, dance, song, film, and both fictional and non-fictional prose. The course aims to deepen understanding of First Peoples' lived realities and cultural narratives.



AP PSYCHOLOGY

Advanced Placement (AP) Psychology

- AP courses are first year university-level courses for high school students
- helps prepare students for university level courses while still in high school
- can take the AP exam in May to potentially score 4 or 5 to receive first year course credit for university (consult with institution of choice)
- nearly all Canadian & U.S. universities accept AP courses as do many international schools for entrance
- AP courses on transcripts can help a student stand out

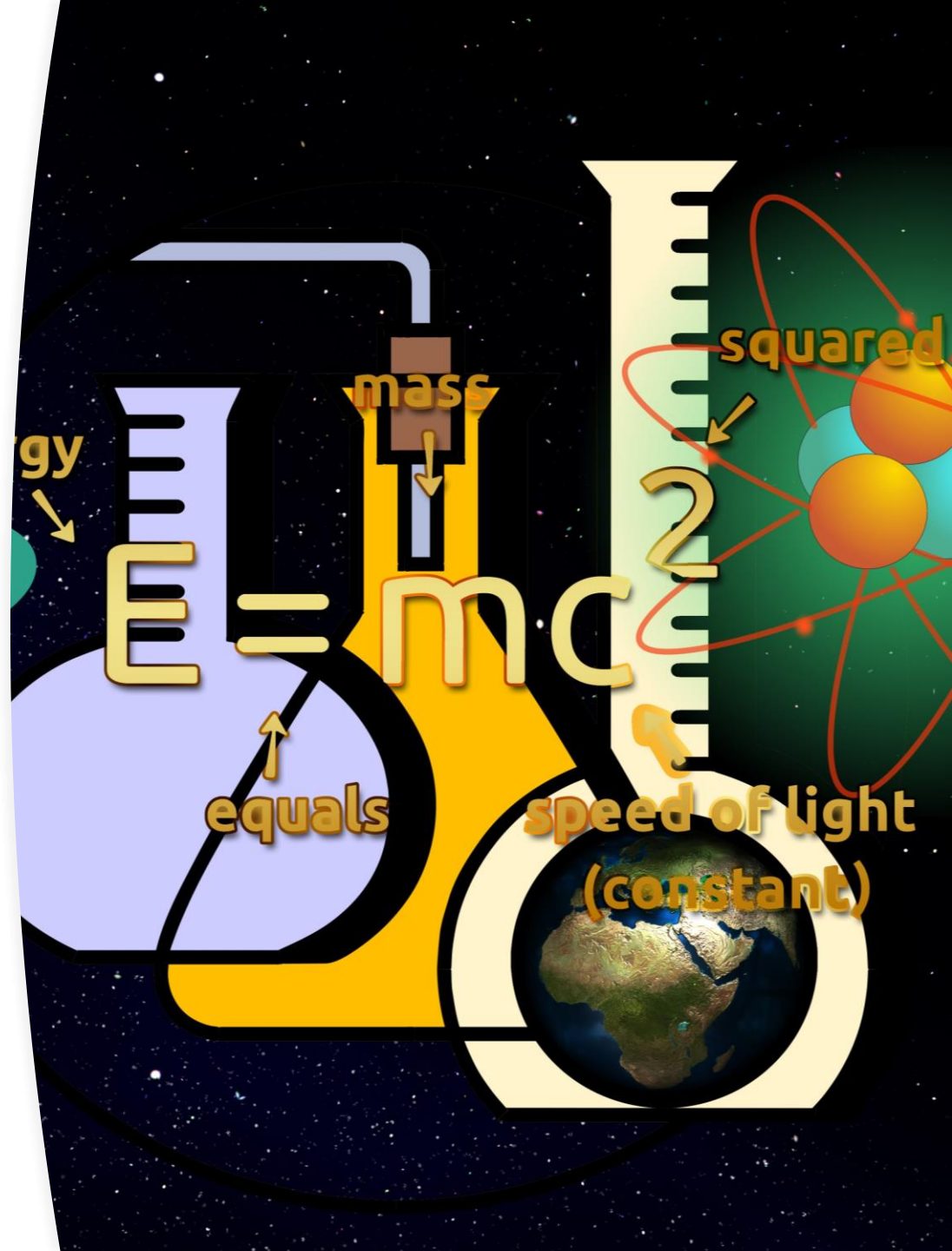

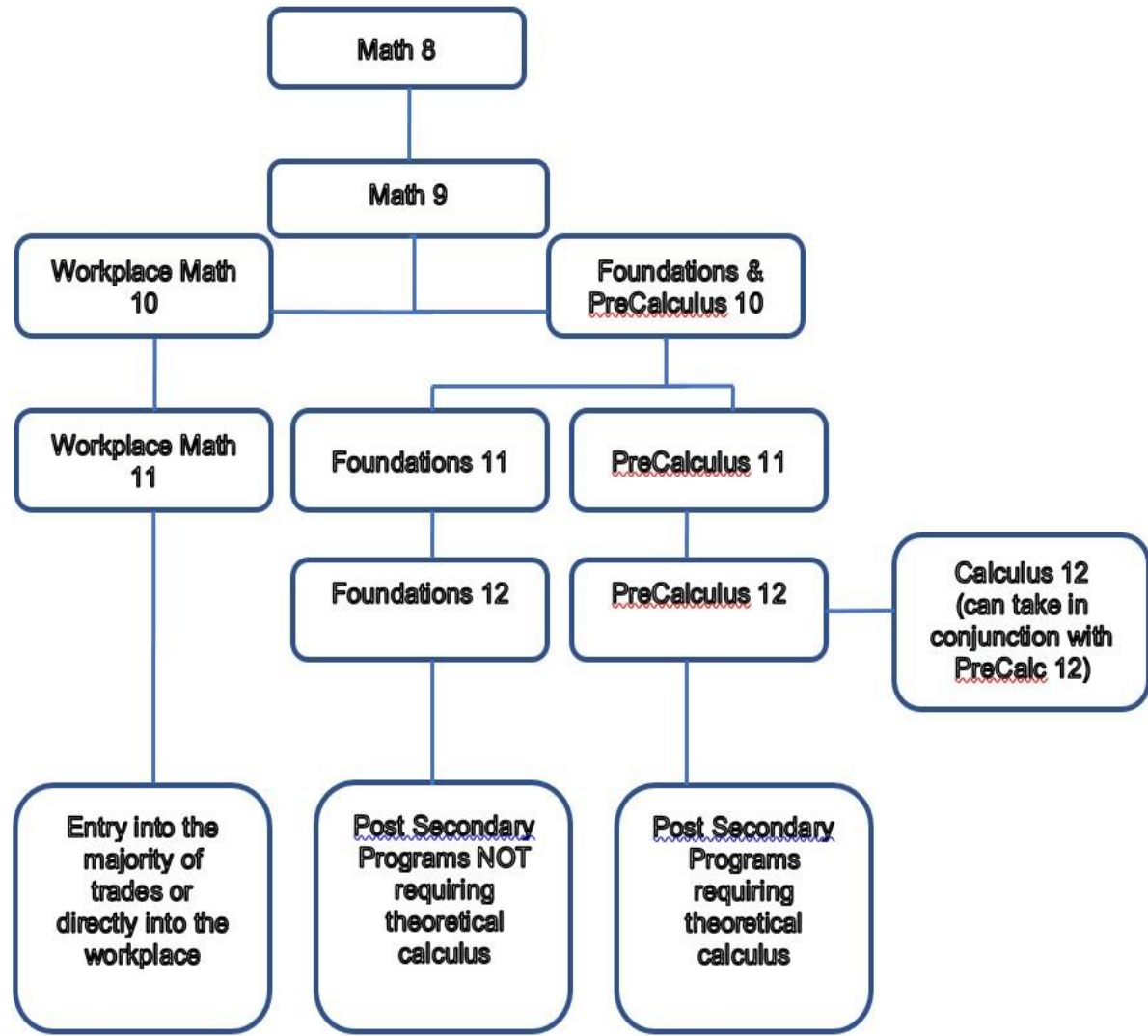

TUTORIAL TIME - FEBRUARY 11TH AND FEBRUARY 12TH

- Programming "Open House" when teachers open Tutorial Time to talk about course offerings, descriptions, pathways, learning styles etc.
- This is a way to give students the opportunity to talk to teachers and for teachers to share info about courses.
- We invite students in to ask questions, seek advice (what level of Math do I need to be comfortable in Physics?, e.g.), get clarity on courses they may have never had the chance to be in before (like our current 8s and 9s in electives), or find out what different strands of courses might look like (Math Foundations, PreCalc, Calc, e.g.)....

Step 3 - Hand in Course Request Form to Main Office BY March 3rd (must be completed AND signed by parent/guardian)

(Students unable to do course request entry at home can get support March 12th or 13th – Completed forms still need to be in office by March 3rd)



Course Request Entry in MyEd

1. Login to MyEd www.myeducation.gov.bc.ca/asp/en
2. Enter your user ID (pupil number followed by nv ie. '123564nv') and password - your user ID and password are on the white sticker on your course sheet!
 - a. You will immediately get a "Password has Expired" pop-up; click OK
 - b. Re-enter your temporary password and then your own password
 - i. Passwords must have 8 characters, 1 upper case letter, 1 numeral and a symbol
 - c. You may be prompted to enter an "Email" for password recovery
 - d. You may be prompted to choose a security question and enter a response (choose something you will remember)
 - e. If you don't have a password and can't log in, come to the library for support.

Now you are in and can do the following...

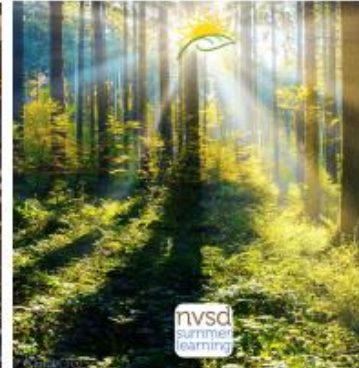
- A. Click on the "My Info" tab along the top of the screen
- B. Click on the "Requests" side tab; check you are in Entry Mode
- C. Read the general instructions then click on the first "Select" button
- D. Use your sheet to choose the correct courses
- E. When you are done selecting courses
 - o Enter any comments for your counsellor as needed
 - o Click on "Post"
- F. Do NOT include alternate courses in MyEd entry (only primary)
- G. Log out!
- H. Return Signed/Completed Course Request Sheet to Office by March 1"

Offers of acceptance will be sent out in early April, to confirm acceptance and secure

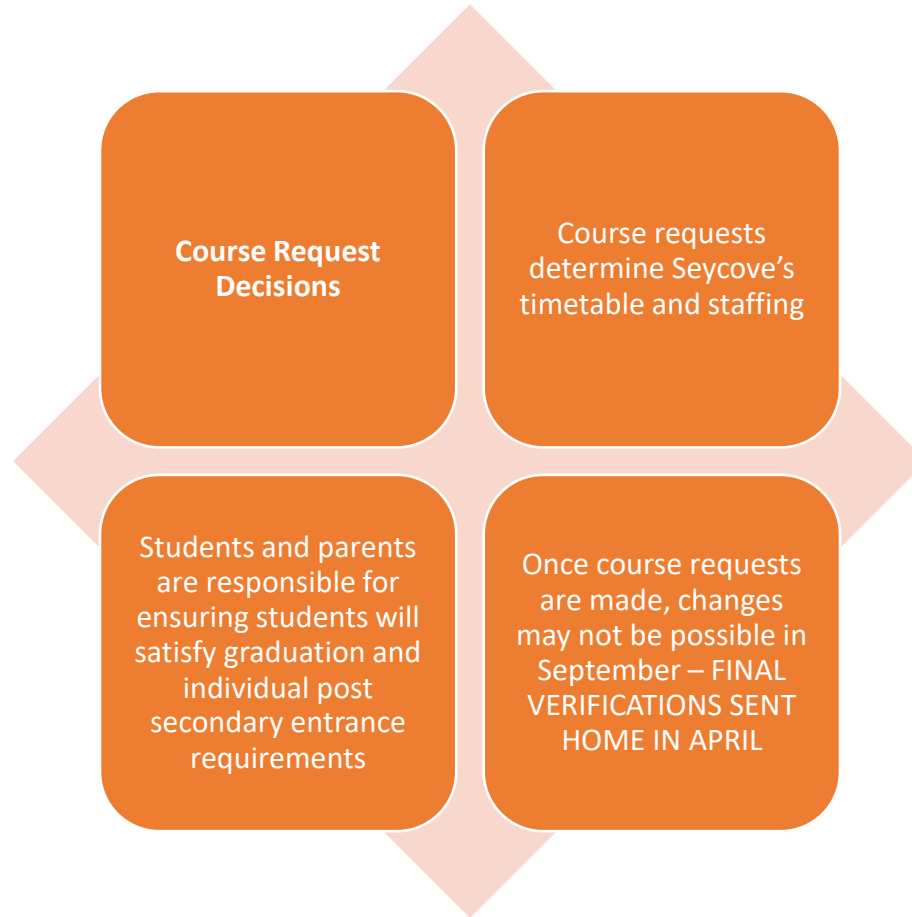
