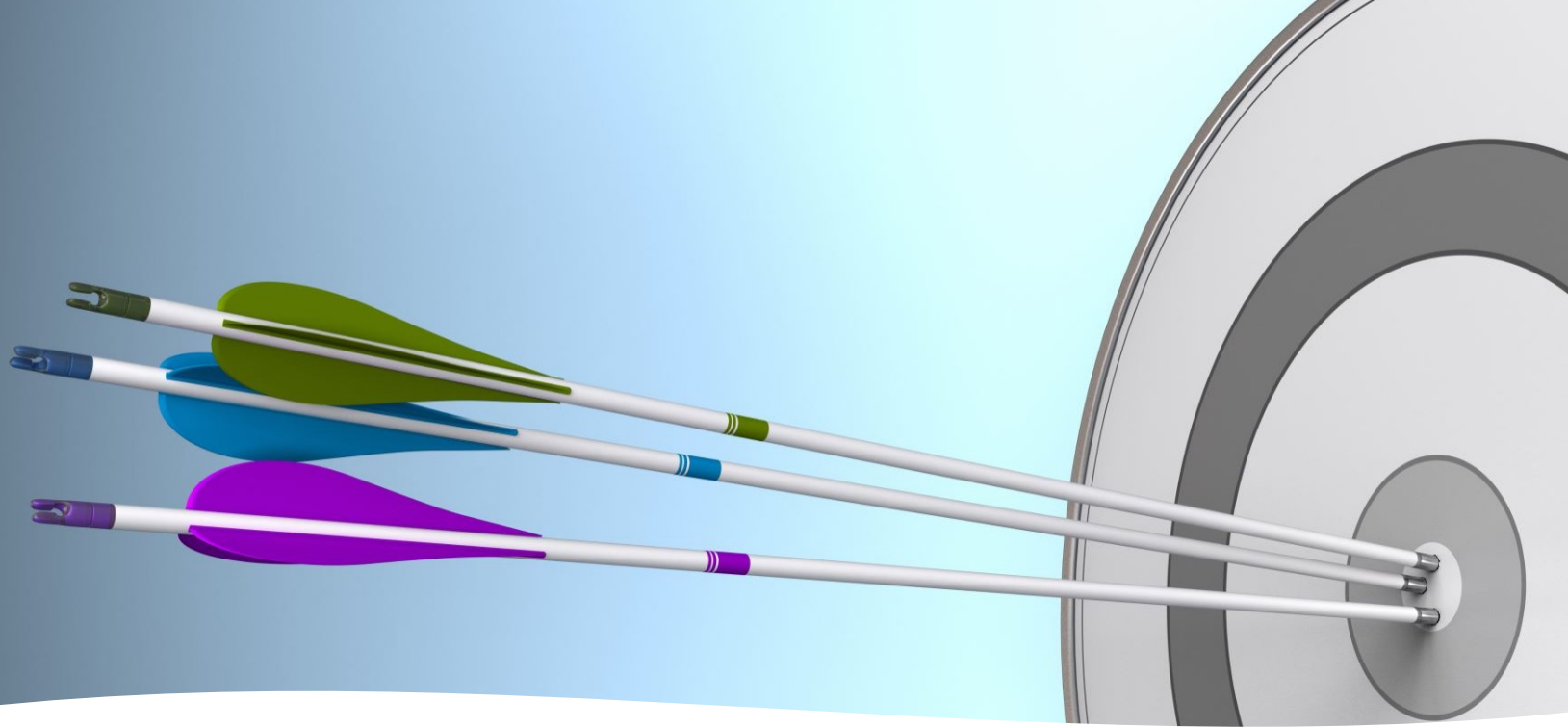
Vision

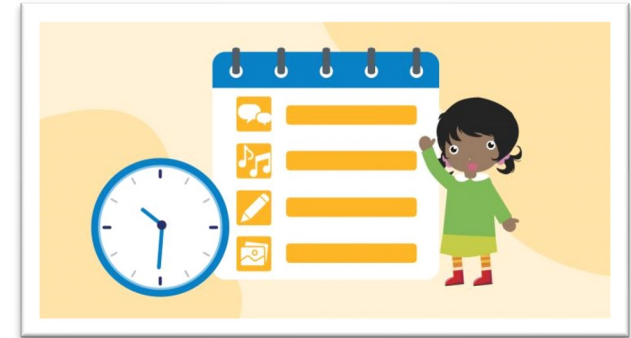

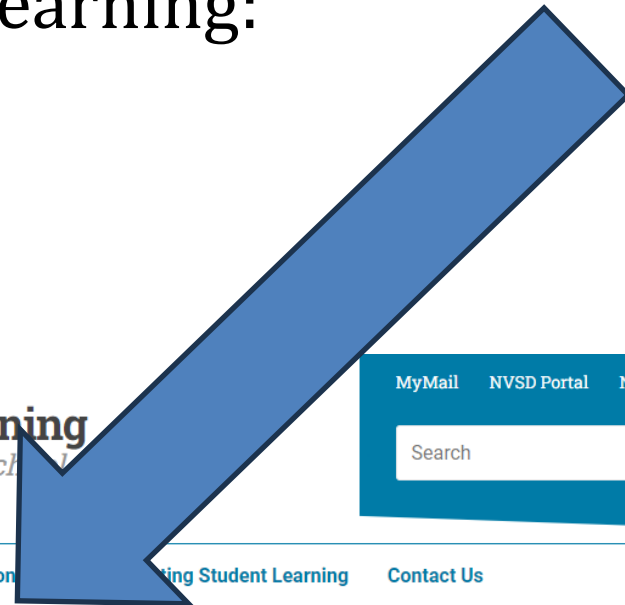

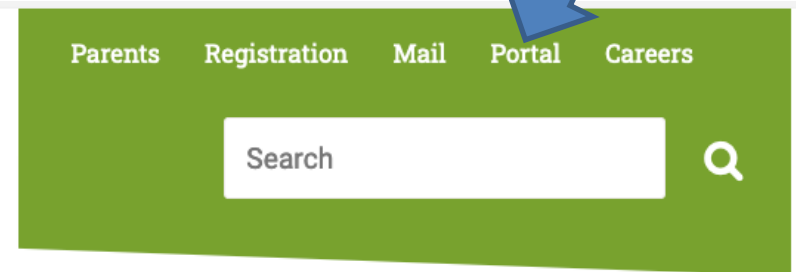


Access to Technology

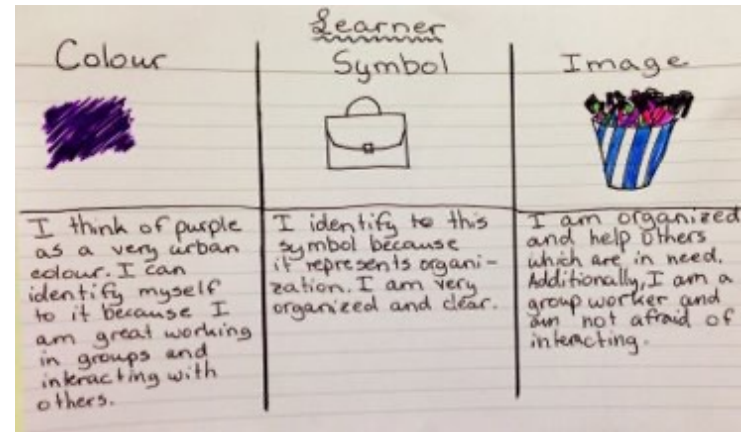

The First Day

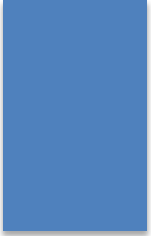


- Arrive for 8:35am
