



Planning for Graduation and Beyond...

"exit plan does not mean entrance plan"

Highschool Graduation

- 80 credits (minimum)
 Grade 10-12
 - 3 Provincial Assessments
- A second language is not required to graduate
- Any Math 11 will meet graduation requirements

Post-Secondary Entrance

- High school graduation with institution specific requirements
- A second language although beneficial to have, is not required to enter UBC and SFU
- Universities require students to take math up to grade 11.
 Consider program – specific requirements when selecting a Math 11 course.
