### Black Bear

Last week, the <u>North Shore Black Bear Society</u> gave presentations to our Intermediate students about living in North Vancouver and sharing our environment with wildlife. The session focused on understanding black bears, as well as other local wildlife, including **cougars, coyotes, and bobcats**.

#### Key Takeaways:

- Living in Bear Country: North Vancouver is home to black bears, and sightings have increased in urban areas like Central and Lower Lonsdale. Bears are drawn to human food sources, which shortens their denning season and increases human-wildlife interactions.
- **Safety and Prevention:** Responsible coexistence is key. Residents can help by securing garbage, removing attractants like fallen fruit, and setting clear boundaries if a bear is on their property.
- Impact of Human Food: Bears that find food in urban areas are at risk of being killed by conservation officers or vehicles. Relocation is not a reliable solution, as new bears quickly take their place.
- **Other Wildlife:** Students also learned about cougars, coyotes, and bobcats, their habits, and how to stay safe around them.

The North Shore Black Bear Society will **return in the coming weeks** to present to our **Primary students**. These sessions help our children understand local wildlife and how to live safely alongside them.
