

### FOOD ACCESS FOR STUDENTS

Windsor has had, for a number of years, a food access program available for students in need. This year we increased the visibility and access to food by setting up a hot and cold water station with a microwave on the 300 level. There are a number of breakfast and snack items available. We encourage students to bring a bowl and spoon for some items. We want to encourage those students who are in need to access this, however, sometimes, students who do not need food access are not bringing lunch as they know this food is available and readily accessible. We want to make sure that as a community we are looking out for each other. Those who are in need should access the food, and those that are not, maybe refrain from it.

#### WHEN REPORTING ABSENCES

-You may report an absence on same the day until 3:00 p.m., in advance for a future date if you know ahead of time, or for previous dates that were missed.

#### Please indicate:

- Student First Name
- Student Last Name (if leaving a voice message please spell the last name)
- Grade
- <u>Date of absence</u> (whole day/portion of the day)
- <u>Explanation for absence</u> ("excused", "ill", "appointment", "vacation"). It is critical that student absence explanations are specific to ensure accurate reporting to the School District and Public Health Unit, when necessary.
- Your name & relationship with the student. (Only messages from parents and legal guardians are accepted

### PARKING AT WINDSOR

Windsor has limited parking for students. Students must park in the lot off of Lytton Street. Please note that in order to ensure all staff can park on school property, the parking lot off of Broadview Dr. is for staff only this year. Students may not park off of Broadview Drive.

In order to park at Windsor students must:

- register their vehicles in the office
- adhere to the parking regulations
- display decal on their windshield

We continue to encourage students to walk or take transit to school.
