





## **Graduation Requirements**

In order to graduate, the BC Ministry of Education requires students to complete the following:

- □ 52 credits "Required" courses, including
   CLC 12, and Indigenous Grad Credit
- □ 28 credits "Elective" courses
- Completion of CLC 12
  - □ Capstone Presentation
  - □ 30 hours work/volunteer experience

## **New Path to Graduation**

#### **Current Grade 12 Students MUST write:**

- Literacy 12 Assessment
- French Literacy 12 Assessment (if French Immersion Student)

#### You should have written in Grade 10:

- Literacy 10 Assessment <u>AND</u>
- Numeracy 10 Assessment



Contact your counsellor if you believe you're missing either of the grade 10 assessments.

Does NOT affect GPA



## Transcripts & Assessment Results through STS

 Transcripts and Assessment results can be accessed through the Ministry of Education web site

#### www.studenttranscripts.gov.bc.ca

- Student will need to create a BCeID account that will follow you to graduation to order transcripts, so please remember your password!
- Counsellors cannot access your account for you



## Marks to Universities

Students must give consent to universities through the STS site

It is an assignment for Unit 4.3 of CLC 12

Final Marks - sent to universities in August **ONLY** if student has authorized marks to be sent.

Universities may rescind your seat if courses not completed or if marks drop substantially.

## Transcripts for other purposes:

 For PSI's which do not appear on STS site, see your counsellor

 Students can download unofficial transcripts directly from STS site <u>themselves</u>

 please see your counsellor



Review and verify accuracy and completeness of Transcript Verification Report



#### **CREATE**

Create a BCeID account to access & consent to release of your transcript to PSI



#### **APPLY**

Begin PSI applications

# Applying to Post-Secondary Institutes (PSI)

### Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT)



#### Needed for:

- American Universities (not mandatory now)
- □ Canadian Universities with NCAA athletics
- Minimum score 840 on SAT to qualify for NCAA eligibility (<u>www.elegibilitycenter.org</u>)

Recommended to write SAT prior to November of gr 12 year, may write more than once

## Applying To Post Secondary Institutions (PSI)

#### In BC, generally:

- PSI application process begins in October online application portals open
- Application deadlines vary usually December –
   March, best to check the specific PSI websites (earlier for major entrance awards)
- Decision of acceptance usually around April/May later for Ontario
- September 2025 course registration begins in June
- Note deadline to apply for Housing!

### **Broad Based Admission**

- Some schools ask for a wider application (not just grades)
- ☐ Tips sheet available from counselling suite
- Students may be asked to submit a personal profile which may include:
  - Written submission
  - Letter of intent
  - ☐ List of accomplishments
  - Personal References
  - Portfolio

Focus on demonstrating reflective and engaged learning.

# English Language Requirements

■ <u>Some</u> post-secondary institutions have an English language requirement

■ If you have been living in British Columbia for less than <u>4 years</u>, and are not proficient in English, you may need to write an English proficiency exam - the TOEFL / IELTS exam... see counsellor for information

### Trades and Apprenticeship

Wages for certified trades are highly desirable

Wages can be earned while student completes program



Employment is often guaranteed at the end of the program

Government Grants/Incentives

### **Minimum Course Requirements**

ENGLISH 12: UBC, SFU min. 70%

UVic min. 67%

### **SECOND LANGUAGE 11**: (Language Challenge ok)

UBC – Language 11, for Bach or Arts: need either Lang 12 or 1<sup>st</sup>/2<sup>nd</sup> year course during degree!) For grad 2025 only

SFU - Grad 2025: Intro language 11 required. For grad 2026: TBD

### **MATH 11:**

UBC - Pre-Calc. 11 OR Foundations 12 min. 67%,

SFU - Foundations 11 min. 60%

### **TOTAL APPROVED GR 12 COURSES:**

UBC – 5-6, SFU/Calgary/Alberta - 5 UVic & most others - 4, Cap U - 3

# Know the Program: Required Courses

- Typical Science or Engineering programs require 2 Grade 12 Sciences PLUS Physics 11
- Typical Social Sciences/Arts programs require 4-5 Grade 12 academic courses (may include a Science)
- Typical Commerce/Business programs require Precalculus 12 (and Calculus is recommended!)
- Each PSI sets their own parameters, which may change!

# Thinking of a Gap Year?

You should still apply to PSI this year



- As long as you do not take courses at another institution, most universities will grant you a Gap Year

- Vocational interest \* may not need above criteria
- Financial need \* requires interview with counsellor
- Decided by Windsor's Scholarship Committee on behalf of donors







# External Scholarships.

### External Scholarships.

Post-Secondary Institutions offer scholarships to secondary school graduate students entering post secondary. Major awards are based primarily on academic involvement. Extracurricular activities and service are considered by some institutions. Many awards are renewable based on academic performance. Some entrance scholarships have limitations. Limited entrance scholarships restrict candidates on criteria other than academic standing (company affiliation, high school location, program being entered, activity involvement, financial need etc.)
Application deadlines vary. Some require school endorsement.



### **Bursaries**

- □ For students in financial need.
- Must indicate 'need' on your application and have interview with counsellor

■Non-repayable financial award

### Student Loans

- □Usually, you apply in September of your post-secondary year
