

Course Description: Intermediate ELL 8-12



ELL is designed to enhance students' proficiency in speaking, reading, writing, and listening in English. The course focuses on building the foundational language skills necessary for academic success and everyday communication. Students will engage in a variety of activities aimed at improving their ability to express ideas clearly and confidently, both in oral and written forms. Reading tasks will focus on comprehension and critical analysis, while writing exercises will emphasize proper structure, organization, and vocabulary development. Listening activities will help students understand spoken English in different contexts and respond appropriately. Students will work collaboratively in group discussions, presentations, and peer review sessions, allowing them to practice and refine their language skills in a supportive environment. The course also encourages students to reflect on their own learning processes, fostering independent learning and cultural sensitivity. Through these activities, students will not only improve their English language proficiency but also develop the skills necessary for success in both academic and social settings.
