Course Description

This course is aimed at exploring the different issues confronting the world today. It will concentrate on the origins of major global issues, its problems, the current conditions, and the approach from national governments. It will also examine how international organizations are addressing these issues. Using critical and creative thinking skills, and examining different perspectives, this course will connect students to the large global community. Students will be expected to participate in class discussions as well as activities outside of the classroom.

Goals for Social Justice 12

The goals of Social Justice 12 are to enable students to acquire knowledge that allows them to recognize and understand the causes of injustice, apply critical thinking and ethical reasoning skills to a variety of social justice issues, develop an understanding of what it means to act in a socially just manner, become responsible agents of change, making positive contributions toward a socially just world.

Evaluation

Students will be assessed based on their contributions to classroom discussions and performance in debates, presentations and various social justice projects including our school-wide symposium in June. Please note that this class uses a cumulative marking system.

Late Assignments

Late assignments will receive a percentile grade but will not receive any feedback. All assignments not submitted on the due date must be submitted prior to the Review and Completion day for the reporting period in which they were assigned. All major assignments must be completed to pass the course.

Although some assignments are designed to be completed during one class, many will be submitted later. Assignments not designed to be submitted by the end of class can be submitted in any of the following manners:
