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Course Description:

Welcome to Windsor's Instrumental Music Program! All courses in Concert Band are designed to provide students with a progressive training in instrumental music. This training includes technical aspects of instrumental performance, basic history and theory as related to the repertoire and guided exploration of many different genres of music. The difference between the band levels is based primarily on the difficulty and complexity of repertoire studied. Intermediate levels focus on an introduction to higher levels of music, complex theoretical concepts and a more rigorous performance schedule.

Big Ideas:

- Music is a unique language for creating and communicating
- Music provides opportunities to gain insight into perspectives and experiences of people from a variety of times, places and cultures
- Growth as a musician requires perseverance, resilience and reflection
- Collaborative music experiences can build community and nurture relationships with others
- Through music making, one's sense of identity and community continually evolves

Course Content & Goals:

- Develop sufficient mastery of the necessary performance techniques on their chosen instrument
- Develop techniques required to play in a variety of jazz ensemble contexts, demonstrating technical competence and stylistic interpretation
- Perform diverse repertoire that includes all major jazz styles
- Develop refined reading, listening and critical thinking skills regarding performance

Ms. Heaven will expect:

- Full participation from students in terms of positive attitude, punctual attendance, respectfulness and teamwork
- Students to come to class with an open mind and a desire to learn
- Full attendance at all concerts

Students can expect:

- To train and perform at a high standard
- To have access to resources, extra coaching, and opportunities for personal development

Assessment & Evaluation:

Students will receive ongoing assessment and evaluation of their progress during each semester through a variety of assessment methods (rubrics, criterion, quizzes, performances and self-assessments) - both formative and summative. It is expected that students will take pride in their work and that any work submitted will reveal a high level of preparation, thought and care.

Assessment Breakdown:

100% - Musicianship, Performance and Participation

- 40% Concerts *** full participation from set up to take down
 Note: concert performances are treated as performance-based
 examinations and are considered the most important exams of each
 semester.
- 20% Personal Musicianship personal preparation and musical selfdiscipline (evidence of regular practice as well as testing of content and technique).
- 30% Daily Rehearsals & Assignments ensemble protocol and expectations contribute positively to the safe learning environment. Equipment care and maintenance, social responsibility, team awareness, regular and punctual attendance.

Course Guidelines:

Practice & Self-Discipline:

It is expected that students show up to rehearsal having practiced and spent time on the music. Class time is for rehearsing the music as a full ensemble – students are expected to prepare their individual parts on their own time or in sectionals.

Attendance Policy & Lateness:

Regular attendance is required for success. As music is a performance-based course, absences will influence assessment and evaluation. Attendance at the ***concerts which are performance-based examinations is mandatory. An unexcused absence from one of these performances is equivalent to missing a term exam.
